Board of Management Road Safety Notice

When possible, please walk, cycle or scoot to school.

Allow your child to alight from the car, only when it is safely parked. Do not let your child alight on the roadway.

Double yellow lines are marked on the roadway, please do not park on these lines.

road. Pause, look left and right to ensure it is safe to crossing.
